Collins Hall is a 3- 1/2 story red brick building, roughly L-shaped. The primary entrance features a nine-light wood door with sidelights. The door surround has a large, plain entablature. A one-story loggia, with three segmental arches, covers the entrance. A secondary entrance on the fatade, in the gable end, has a four-light wood door, with an entablature surround. Other features of the building include 8-over-8 window sash, Flemish bond brick pattern, splayed-brick lintels (some on the first floor have keystones), fanlight windows, cornice modillions and pedimented dormers.

43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary)

Completed in 1952 at a cost of \$703,000, Collins Hall was designed by Charles F. Cellarius. The residence hall, designed to house male freshmen, was first occupied in January 1953. An addition was added in 1956. The building was named in honor of Joel Collins. Collins was an early pioneer to the township. Following his leadership in siting Miami University, he served as superintendent of grounds and college buildings from 1815-1827. He was secretary to the Board of Trustees from 1822-1855. Collins also was elected to Ohio's General Assembly.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52)

Collins Hall is in the northeastern portion of the campus. Built at the same time, Collins mirrors McBride Hall across from it. Together, along with Dennison Hall, they form a small cluster of dormitories that was historically referred to as the men's quadrangle and is now called East Quad.


