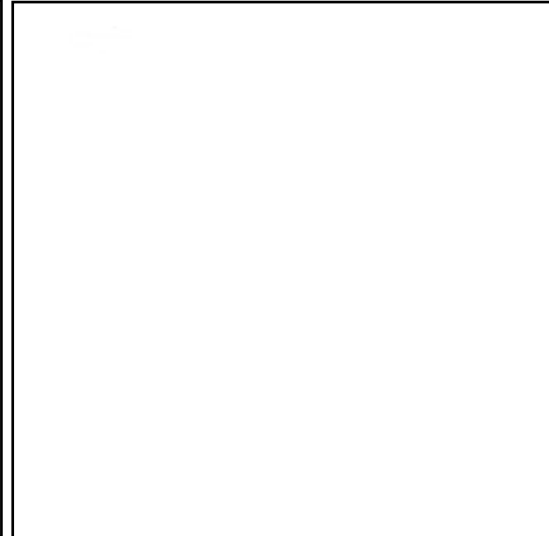
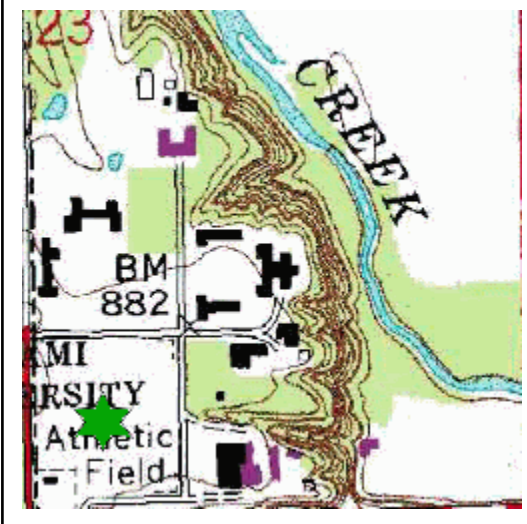

Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Continued on Reverse if Necessary) Cook Field consists of approximately 12 acres of ground located at S.R. 73 and Patterson Avenue. It is a level and grassy open space for student athletics and campus events. The field is rectangular in shape, without any distinguishing architectural or landscape features. Large light poles are regularly spaced around the field to provide night lighting. Just outside the southwest corner of the field is Pulley Tower, a brick and frame clock tower.				
43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary) This tract of ground was originally under the ownership of the Cook family who operated the Oxford Retreat here during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The athletic field was laid out in 1911 and leased by the university before its purchase from Dr. Robert Harvey Cook in 1923. Miami used the field for school athletics and for Air Force and Naval ROTC inspections and training. During the 1950s, the field was used for intramural sports. Cook Field continues to function as a location for a variety of campus events and festivals, along with sports activities.				
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52) Cook Field is located in the East Campus of Miami University, at the intersection of S.R. 73 and Patterson Avenue. It is directly across Patterson Avenue from Bishop Woods. Academic, administrative and residential facilities are located nearby.
