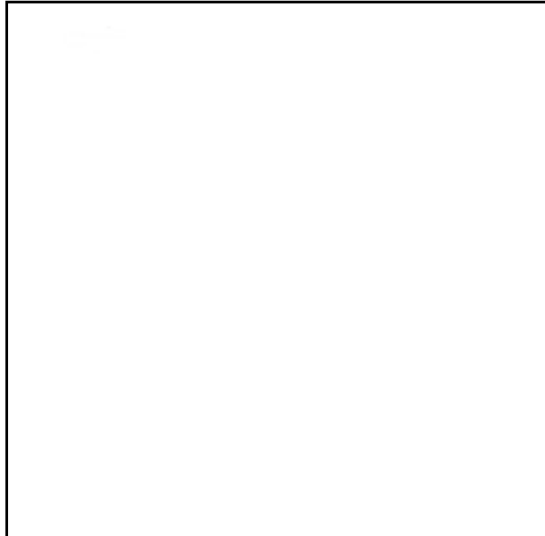
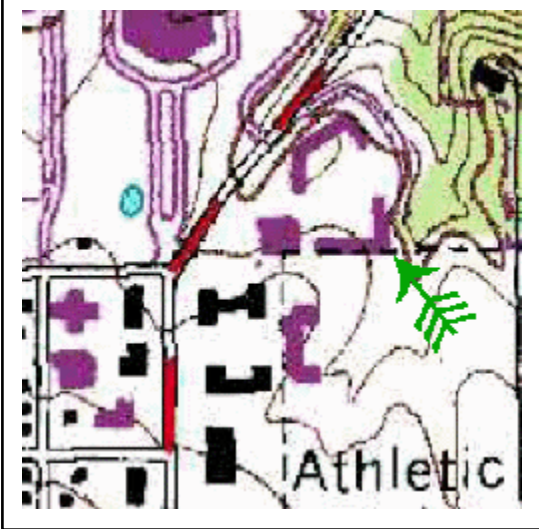

42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Continued on Reverse if Necessary)				
<p><b>Hahne Hall is a 3-1/2 story red brick building. It is L-shaped, with the primary entrance cornered in the ell. The entrance is emphasized by a two-story angled porch. The porch has simplified Corinthian columns, a geometric balustrade, and cornice modillions. A square patio area, with brick-walled access ramps, extends outward from the covered porch. The twelve-light door has sidelights and a plain entablature surround. A secondary entrance on the facade has a small one-story porch, with cornice modillions and a triglyph and metope entablature. It is supported by paired Doric columns. The nine-light wood door has a simple surround. Some of the second and third floor windows are contained within a slight, boxed-bay projection. Other features of the building include 8-over-8 window sash, Flemish bond brick pattern, splayed-brick lintels (some on the first floor have keystones), fanlight windows, cornice modillions and pedimented dormers.</b></p>				
43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary)				
<p><b>Completed in 1966 at a cost of \$1,415,000, Hahne Hall was designed by Cellarius and Hilmer. It has a residential capacity for 353 and currently is a coed upperclass hall. Dedicated on April 15, 1967, the building was named in honor of Ernest H. Hahne. Ernest Hahne served as Miami's president from 1946-1952. He is credited with starting the Miami University Foundation and establishing the Graduate School with its own dean.</b></p>

<p><b>Hahne Hall is in the northern portion of the campus, just past the cluster of Hepburn, McFarland and Brandon Halls. It faces a grass lawn and Flower Hall.</b></p>
