42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Continued on Reverse if Necessary) This building consists of a 2-1/2 story gable-roofed brick section with an attached 1-story gabled wing. The main section has a 3-bay facade, central entrance with sidelights, pedimented entry portico, modillion block cornice, and slate roof with 3 gabled dormers. On the west side is the one-story wing that terminates in a 3-bay gable facing the street. An entrance located here has a flat-roofed portico. The building makes use of Flemish bond brick, with brick flat arch lintels. The wood shutters appear to be an original feature, along with the 8/8 wood windows.				
43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary) Hanna House was built in 1963 and dedicated in 1964 as a home management facility for the university. It is one of the most modest designs on the Miami campus by Cincinnati architects Cellarius and Hilmer. The main house was comparable to a four-bedroom home, with the attached one-story wing serving as a nursery school. The building was named in honor of Martha Jane Hanna, a member of the Miami faculty from 1915 to 1947 and the first professor and department chair in the Department of Home Economics. She arrived at the MU campus in 1915 to head the department, was made a full professor in 1918, and became professor emeritus in 1947. She died in 1958.				
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52) Hanna House is located on Spring Street at the west end of the Miami University campus. It is across from McGuffey Hall and adjacent to Wells Hall. Although in an area of large scale university buildings, it maintains a smaller-scale residential appearance through its setting.

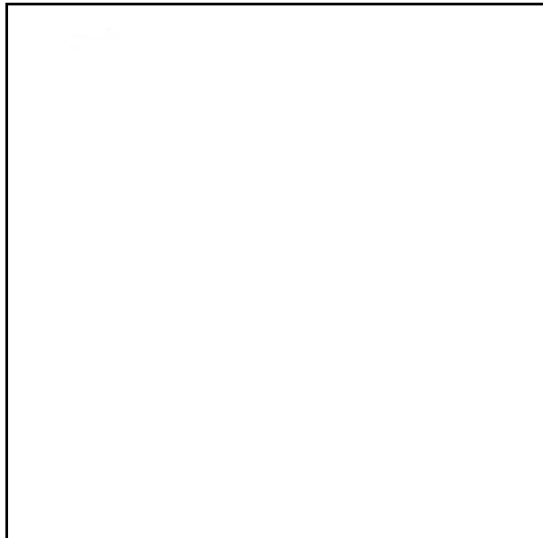
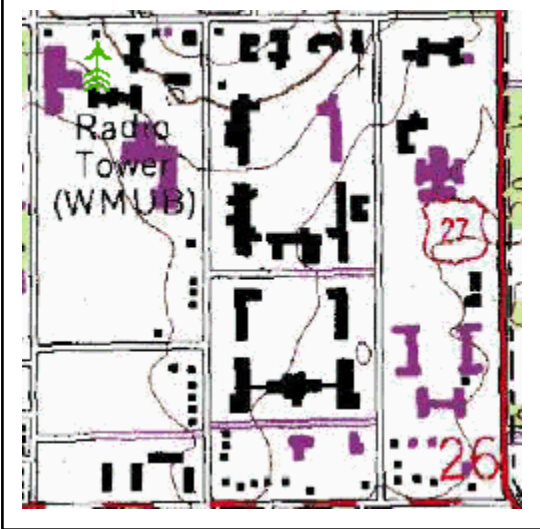
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8. Site Plan with North Arrow
