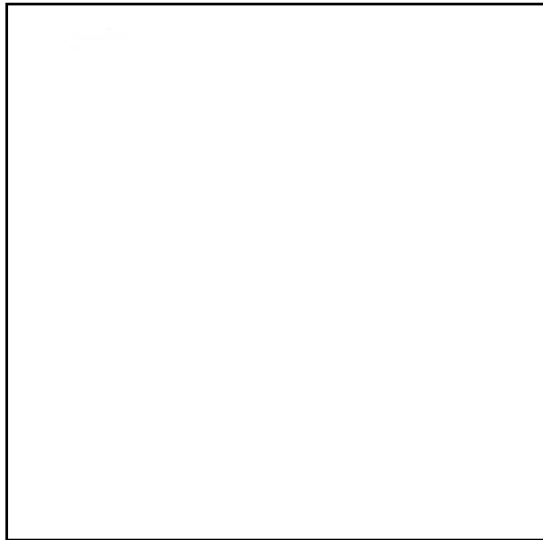
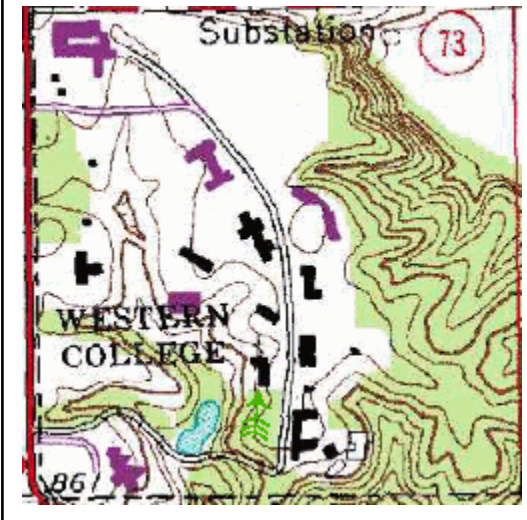

Five Gothic-arched stained glass windows also exist in the apse, with symbolism relating to the Bible and the arts and sciences of liberal education. Kumler Chapel's slate roof was restored and its walls repaired in 2008.
