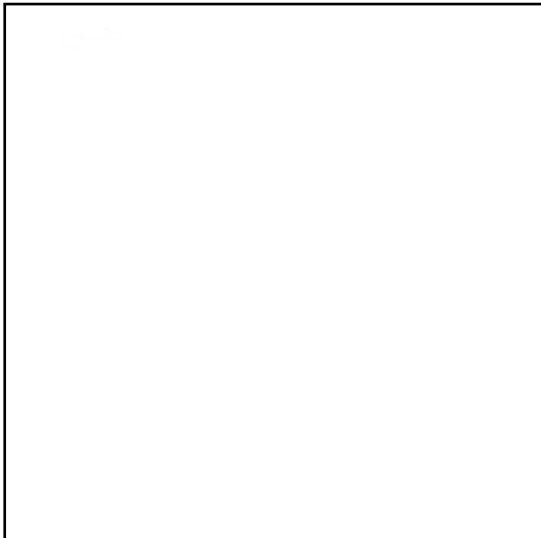
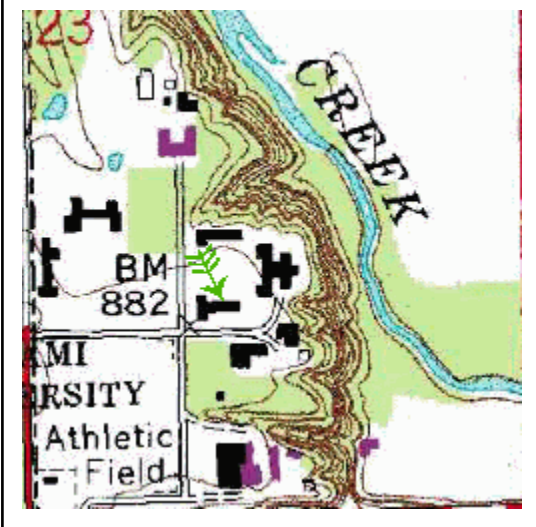

42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Continued on Reverse if Necessary)				
<p><b>McBride Hall is a 3-1/2 story red brick building, roughly L-shaped. The primary entrance features a four-light wood door with sidelights. The door surround has a large, plain entablature. A one-story loggia, with three segmental arches, covers the entrance. A secondary entrance on the facade, in the gable end, has a six-light wood door, with an entablature surround. Other features of the building include 8-over-8 window sash, Flemish bond brick pattern, splayed-brick lintels (some on the first floor have keystones), fanlight windows, cornice modillions and pedimented dormers.</b></p>				
43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary)				
<p><b>Completed in 1952 at a cost of \$689,000, Collins Hall was designed by Charles F. Cellarius. The residence hall, designed to house 147 men, was first occupied in February 1953. The building was named in honor of James McBride. McBride was a surveyor and early settler in Oxford. He was the first secretary to the Board of Trustees from 1809-1820. McBride was elected to serve a term, 1822-23, in Ohio's General Assembly and was a leader of the Whig party.</b></p>				
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52)				
<p><b>McBride Hall is in the northeastern portion of the campus. McBride mirrors Collins Hall across from it. Together, along with Dennison Hall, they form a small cluster of dormitories that was historically referred to as the men's quadrangle and is now called East Quad.</b></p>
