42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Continued on Reverse if Necessary)

Swing Hall is a three story, Georgian Revival building. It is a u-shaped edifice that faces Tallawanda Road. The centered entrance is at the base of a tower projection. It has paired wood doors, with 8 lights and a multi-light transom. The door surround features a stone pediment, supported by lonic columns. Atop the projecting clock tower is a cupola, surrounded by a simple wood balustrade. The gable end entrances have wood doors with 9 lights and a stone surround comprised of an entablature lintel, supported by curved consoles. The projecting lintel forms a shallow balcony, with decorative metal rail, for the window above. The upper story window has a stone surround with a centered cartouche. The building remains unchanged, since previously recorded in 1999.

43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary)

Constructed in two sections, Swing Hall was a men's dormitory, designed by Robert S. Harsh. The south wing was built first, for a cost of \$80,000, and finished in 1924. It was the first dormitory north of High Street and initially called the New Freshman Dormitory. The north and central wings, which included a dining hall and the clock tower, were added in 1935, partially using Public Works Administration funds. The PWA granted \$79,000 of the \$254,000 total cost of the additions. The building's additions were designed by architectural firm, Harsh & Davies. It was designed to house 220 freshmen, a lounge overlooking the golf course, a post office, and game rooms. Following completion of the 1935 additions, the building was renamed Swing Hall, in honor of David Swing. Swing graduated continued...

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52)

Swing Hall is in the northern portion of the campus. It is adjacent to large-scale, newly constructed buildings.


